

Acute P-Listed Waste

Acutely hazardous medications need different level of disposal and should be packaged and shipped in their own RCRA Container. This includes the wrappers and packaging for these medications.

Items that are acute P-Listed

Nicotine (does not include Nicotine patches)

Items that are Incompatibles

* Each of the below must go into their own Black RCRA bin and are considered incompatibles:



Pharmaceutical Aerosols (inhalers)



Corrosives (I.e Sodium Hydroxide, Glacial Acetic Acid)



Oxidizers (i.e. Unused silver nitrate, sodium nitrate)

REGULAR HAZ VS ACUTE P-LISTED HAZ WASTE



RCRA HAZ | RCRA pharmaceuticals, bulk chemotherapy and listed waste **not** described on this poster may be combined-disposed of in a black hazardous waste bin.



ACUTE P-LISTED HAZ | P-Listed pharmaceuticals listed on this poster must be disposed of separately from other RCRA hazardous waste. "Incompatibles" must go into their own RCRA bin (**i.e. different incompatibles may not be combined.**)
