Tamper-proof containment before collection, ensuring waste is sealed in leakproof packaging




Waste Consolidation and readiness for storage and transport that minimizes risk of spillage and cross-contamination



PROPER SHARPS DISPOSAL

OPEN





Slide the front lock to the left.

2 Lift lid until it locks open.

SYRINGE DISPOSAL






Drop syringes horizontally onto tray.

2 Tray will empty itself.

LIGHT SHARPS DISPOSAL





Drop syringes horizontally onto tray.

2 Manually lift the tray to empty.

FULL



When the tray remains vertical, the collector is full.

CLOSE





Press both side supports inward, and close lid.

2 Slide the front lock fully to the right.

LOCK

NOTE: SIDE LOCKS ARE PERMANENT!

Depress red tabs.

2 Slide locks completely forward & replace the collector.
